Erasmus Students

This factsheet is designed to complement any information for Erasmus Students available on our website. Please read it carefully and contact us if you have any further questions.

University-allocated accommodation

Availability

Students coming to study at Bristol as part of the University's Erasmus programme are not guaranteed accommodation in halls and unfortunately it is very unlikely that there will be vacancies available in September 2019.

Therefore, we would strongly suggest that you continue to look for private accommodation as soon as possible.

If you are interested in halls you should still apply. <http://www.bristol.ac.uk/accommodation/undergraduate/erasmus-students/> Applications will be open from May 8th but we will not be able to let you know until early September if you have a place or not.

Please note applications will be closed between 28th July and 15th August but will re-open after this period.

University accommodation

If we are able to offer you accommodation it is likely to be in a shared room with another undergraduate student of the same gender as yourself. Shared rooms have reduced rent rates and the rent is inclusive of all bills, internet, and a bus pass if you are at Stoke Bishop.

You will make a small one-off payment of around £40 on top of your rent for contents insurance and membership of the Junior Common Room at your residence, which enables you to benefit from a variety of social and cultural events organised by your residence.

Your accommodation payment will be due in mid-October or mid-January 24th depending upon when your tenancy starts.

Private Accommodation

Looking for Accommodation in September

When looking for accommodation in the private sector, please be aware that competition for student housing starting in September is very strong and it can be challenging to find somewhere to live. The earlier you start looking the better.

We advise that you visit the UK while you look for accommodation if possible or come to Bristol a couple of weeks before the start of your course to house hunt.

You should not arrange long-term private rented accommodation from overseas or transfer money unless you are 100% sure the arrangement is genuine. If you are in any doubt, contact us for advice immediately.

Right to Rent

All private landlords in England have to check that prospective tenants have the right to live in the UK. House Search Event

To assist you in finding accommodation the Accommodation Office run a house search event, see <http://www.bristol.ac.uk/accommodation/privately-rented/finding-privately-rented-accommodation/postgraduate-and-erasmus-house-search-event/> to give students the opportunity to stay in Bristol for three nights to meet other students and to look for accommodation either as a group or individually. This event is not suitable for the one semester students.

Private Accommodation Budget

Rents and bills vary enormously but you should allow **at least** £535 per month to cover all your housing costs, preferably more. Rents vary hugely from £400 - £550 + bills per month for a room in a shared house to £700+ per month for a studio in a commercial residence.

You will normally be required to pay at least one month's rent as a deposit and one month's rent in advance before you take up your private tenancy.

Rooms in shared houses don't usually include bills. The average monthly cost per person in a 4-bed shared house is:

- Utilities (gas, electricity, water) £50
- Internet: £10
- Insurance: £10
- Broadband £10

Rents in commercial properties usually include bills.

UK Guarantor

When booking private accommodation, you will often be asked to provide the name and address of someone in the UK who will promise to pay your rent or for any damage if you are not able to. This person is known as a 'guarantor'. If you don't have one, then you may be asked for the full years rent upfront.

Housinghand.co.uk

This organisation will act as a guarantor for students for a fee of £225 or 8 monthly payments of £30. See <http://www.bristol.ac.uk/accommodation/privately-rented/finding-privately-rented-accommodation/guarantors/> You will need to check that your landlord will accept their guarantee though.
