10.00am Acupuncture in Dentistry

David Johnson

David treats children for four days a week in the Cardiff area and on the other day is a Lecturer in Oral Medicine at Cardiff Dental Hospital. This involves undergraduate teaching and the treatment of a wide range of facial pain with acupuncture or as part of a combination therapy. He is registered with both the British Medical and Dental Acupuncture Societies.

Acupuncture has been used in China for more than 3000 years and can be a very useful addition to the dentist's toolbox. It has been used successfully for the treatment of TMJ problems, trigeminal neuralgia and burning-mouth syndrome.

By the end of this session you will have:

- understood the principles of how acupuncture works
- reviewed the uses of acupuncture in dentistry
- identified acupuncture points
- carried out practical needling of acupuncture points
- reviewed auriculotherapy

2.00pm Management of Paediatric Trauma

David Johnson

David has a special interest in the management of child patients. We will be looking at the management of dental trauma as it affects our younger patients. How we manage trauma in the first few days will affect our patients' recovery and long-term dental health. The financial and ethical implications can be far-reaching.

Aim: To guide VDPs in treatment planning for dental trauma using actual case histories.

Objectives:

By the end of the session you should be more confident in dealing with:

- complicated dental trauma
- dental trauma of medically compromised children
- dental trauma incorporating orthodontic assistance
- later complications of dental trauma

The Problem with Dentures!

Graham Stokes

Graham is a Worcestershire man born and bred. He grew up, went to school and now lives in Malvern. He is the senior partner at LHDP Smilecare a general dental practice and referral centre in Bromsgrove. He takes referrals in implants and major dental reconstruction work. He has been a VT adviser for 10 years and is also currently the adviser for BDA Advance. He is passionate about dentistry and education. He is heavily involved in postgraduate dental education locally and nationally and sits on the British Dental Association's Representative Body and the BDA education committee. He is currently the President of the West Midlands British Dental Association Branch. He is a special adviser and clinical lead for the dental charity Bridge2aid providing education and dental care to some of the poorest people in the world in Tanzania.

Do you see making full dentures as a shot in the dark? Do you say a little prayer whenever you fit a set of dentures in the hope they will be stable?

Full denture creation is a skill that can be learnt. This programme will lead you through all the stages of full dentures from diagnosis to after care to help you develop systems and skills to minimize the unpredictability of full denture provision. Each stage of the clinical process if approached in the correct manner can help you be confident of a successful result. You will look at methods of recreating the patient's own smile.

By the end of the day you will be armed with useful tips and skills to aid you provide full dentures and a good protocol to help with the provision of partial dentures.

Please bring any cases you might feel would be of interest for the group. These can be successes or failures or just cases you would like treatment planning advice on.

Aims and Objectives

By the end of the course participants will have an understanding of:

- How to take successful impressions
- How to record accurately the bite
- How to choose the shape and size of tooth
- How to set up the occlusion in full dentures
- How to deal with common complications such as a flabby ridge
- To have understood the need for care on providing good dentures
- To have understood a better understanding of partial denture design
- To have an improved knowledge of the principles and theory of good impression techniques

Leading the Team Professor Liz Kay

Professor Elizabeth Kay is dean of Peninsula dental school, and amongst her many roles has been scientific Advisor for the British Dental Association, on the Boards of Director/Trustees for the British Dental Health Foundation, Professor of Dental Health Services Research and Director of Public and Professional Relations at the University of Manchester Dental School, and Clinician Tutor for Inhalation Sedation. Professor Kay was also a member of the Manchester Dental Programme New Curriculum Development Team. Past and current areas of Professor Kay's research have included Oral Health Promotion, decision making in oral health, the incorporation of patient views and values into health care treatment and policy, dental education and investigations into the effect of pre-graduation clinical practice on preparedness and confidence for a career in general dental practice.

The aims of the day are to introduce the FD's to transactional analysis and neuro-linguistic programming, to reinforce primary, secondary and tertiary prevention and to discuss preparedness for practice.

Communication and Conflict Resolution

Adam Porter

Covering the GDC recommended core CPD areas: Complaints Handling and Ethical Issues.

This is an enjoyable and informative way to update these GDC core topics.

Adam Porter (dentist and professional actor) and his colleagues at Healthcare Interact have been providing CPD courses for dental practices and dental foundation training courses since 2006, through Wales Dental Postgraduate Department. We have taken this essential training course to almost half of all dental practices in Wales, as well as all Welsh DFT groups and several in England.

The training is constructed around role-play scenarios performed by actors. This is an informal and entertaining session, not an exam or OSCE, so there is no pressure or expectation and participants are not required to "act": simply to be themselves, and offer advice to the myriad of different patients we will portray. Put simply, let us do the acting!

The group is invited to discuss and debate the scenarios we present, many of which will present an ethical dilemma, as well as to talk through their own experiences of conflict. The session focuses on the importance of team work and promotes a team approach to resolving conflict. Participants will learn about approaches to dealing with aggressive and potentially violent patients at reception and in the surgery; the root causes of conflict with patients; working through ethical dilemmas; and dealing with complaints.

Directions by car and parking

From the north or east, join the Churchill Way ring road and follow the signs for the District Hospital.

From the west on the A30/A36 turn right at Park Wall junction, Wilton onto the A3094 to avoid going through Salisbury and follow the signs for the District Hospital.

From the south follow the A338 towards Salisbury, pass the park and ride on your left and take the next left at the traffic lights and left at the top of the hill.

Entrances to the hospital are marked 'A' and 'B' and the car parks are numbered and clearly signposted for patient/visitor parking. Your appointment information will tell you which car park is closest to your ward/clinic.
