## University homes

PROPOSALS to develop more than 1,000 homes in Long Ashton will be discussed at a public consultation exhibition this week.

The University of Bristol has drawn up a blueprint for up to 1,200 houses on its 69-hectare Fenswood Farm, which is largely hidden from view between the rail line to Weston and the A370 Long Ashton bypass.

The former research station closed in 2003 and has since had nearly 400 homes built on it by Wimpey, which bought the site for £25 million.

This ended 100 years of agricultural research and, as the university's farming activities have steadily declined, it is now looking to cash in on the site's value.

Earlier this year, campaign group Hands Off Long Ashton, described the scheme as "potentially the most dangerous the village has seen".

The exhibition takes place at the Royal British Legion, 1 Providence Lane, in the village on Thursday, October 29, from 2-7pm with a meet the team session from 5-7pm.
