The members of the Committee taking part in the review gave a favourable ethical opinion of the amendment on the basis described in the notice of amendment form and supporting documentation.

This amendment sought approval for the following changes:

Consent to contact forms: wording had been altered to make the forms more precise as well as requested proof of DoB. Participants aged 16-17 do not need parents to consent on their behalf, however parents would be asked to complete parental questionnaires and do need to provide consent to this research procedure. The intent to use data collected during the feasibility study for the full scale trial, point has now been added to PCF.

Consent to discussion: Addition of Clearer instruction on how to complete the form, the parental consent box has been removed from the 16-17 consent form and overall made more child friendly.
