SINGLE HONOURS

You are required to take 120 credits worth of units – 40 credits of which are made up by the Dissertation (CLAS32315)

You must take four optional units (two in each Teaching Block) to make up your remaining 80 credits. Please choose from the table overleaf your optional units for TB1 by numbering from 1-8 in order of preference, 1 being your first choice and so on. You will be allocated to two. Please choose your TB2 units by numbering 1-9 in order of preference. You will be allocated to two. Students indicating Greek and/or Latin units as high preferences (1-4) must specify, in the space given, which level (A, B, C or D) they are taking.

Please note that Classics students MUST take two units made up of Greek and/or Latin as part of their optional units. You also choose two other optional units.

JOINT HONOURS – MANDATORY UNITS

You are required to take 60 credits worth of units in Classics & Ancient History across the year.

English/Classical Studies: You must take either CLAS32315 Dissertation (40 Credits), and one optional unit (20 credits) or, if taking the Dissertation in English (ENGL39021), three optional units (20 credits each). There is a table overleaf for you to indicate which Dissertation you have chosen.

Ancient History/Archaeology: You must take CLAS30087 Dissertation (20 credits) (together with ARCH30087 at 20 credits making a 40 credit Dissertation in total). You must then choose two optional units (20 credits each) from the table overleaf.

Classical Studies/Philosophy: You must take CLAS32315 Dissertation (40 credits) and one optional unit (20 credits).

Please choose from the table overleaf your optional units by numbering 1-6 in order of preference, 1 being your first choice and so on. You will be allocated as many as your programme specifies. Please note that your credits should be as equal as possible when making your selection (60 credits total in each teaching block across your joint programme), this will be taken into consideration when allocating your optional units.

Students indicating that they wish to take Greek and/or Latin units must specify, in the space given, which level (A, B, C or D) they are taking.
