Muslim Participation in Contemporary Governance (MPCG) is a Bristol University research project funded by the AHRC/ESRC research programme on Religion & Society. The project investigates how UK governance includes British Muslims and how Muslims themselves become involved in consultations, partnerships, and governance networks. It is the most comprehensive study to date on UK Muslim-government relations, and includes an analysis of public policy since 1997, more than 100 interviews with key policymakers and Muslim civil society actors, and in-depth local case studies of Birmingham, Leicester, and Tower Hamlets, London.

This public event will launch the MPCG final report **TAKING PART** and will feature the main research findings with responses from an expert panel. The report provides insight on public policy issues such as faith relations and countering extremism.
