Scholarship Application Guidance

This document provides an overview of the full application process for the Think Big international scholarship scheme at the University of Bristol.

Please note, you must submit an application to study before applying for a scholarship. If you have not yet submitted an application to study at Bristol starting in September 2024 then you cannot apply for a scholarship. For details about applying for a course, please visit our international applications page.

About the Scholarship

The Think Big Scholarship scheme offers tuition fee scholarships of up to £13,000 per year of study, as well as one-off living cost bursaries of up to £3,000 to support prospective international students undertaking their first year of study at the University of Bristol.

Who can apply?

Applicants must be considered an overseas fee payer and have applied to an eligible* full-time Undergraduate course at the University of Bristol, beginning in September 2024.

* All courses with the exception of Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science are eligible.

Please note that scholarship applicants can submit an application before receiving a formal offer to study from the University, but they need to have at least applied to an eligible course.

What we fund?

Think Big scholarship awards are applied to tuition fees only for every year that an awardee is in full time study. Awards will not be given during years in industry, abroad etc. where an awardee is not required to pay full fees.

In addition to scholarship awards, awardees may receive a living cost bursary of up to £3,000. These are awarded in the first year of study only and are paid directly into the student's bank account during the first term of study, once they have opened a UK bank account and registered in full.

Navigating the form

There are two application forms, one for postgraduate applicants and one for undergraduate applicants. Make sure you fill out the relevant form.

We have collated some tips for you to help navigate the form when filling in your application:

- 1. There is no save function, so you will need to complete the application form in one session. You will need to answer all required questions to move forward with the application if you have not answered anything an error message will appear informing you of this.
- 2. There will be an opportunity to review your answers once you have completed all sections however, once you select 'submit' this is final, and you will not be able to make any changes to your application after this.
- 3. If you are completing the form on a smartphone you may need to turn your phone to landscape to see all the text.

To help you prepare, we have outlined the information you will need below.



Writing your application

In this section you will find all the questions asked within the Think Big scholarship application. As you are unable to save while completing the application, we would recommend you draft your essay responses in a separate document before submitting your application.

Application to Study Check

Before beginning your scholarship application, prospective applicants must have applied to an eligible course of study at the University of Bristol and received an application ID. Without an eligible application ID, a scholarship application will not be considered and will be automatically deleted.

Section 1 - Personal Details

Q1. [Mandatory] How did you apply for your undergraduate course?

There are several application routes available when applying to study at the University of Bristol. Please select which method you used, either through UCAS, Kaplan, the Global Transfer Programme or via the International Foundation programme pathway.

Q2. [Mandatory] UCAS ID / Student ID / Kaplan ID

Enter the application ID which corresponds to your application route.

Q3. [Mandatory] What degree have you applied for at the University of Bristol?

Select the course that you have applied for from the menu. Please note that if your course is not on this list then unfortunately it is not eligible for a Think Big scholarship.

Q4. [Mandatory] Do you intend to make University of Bristol your Firm choice with UCAS?

If your scholarship application is successful, you will need to ensure you make University of Bristol your firm choice with UCAS for the 2024/25 academic year in order to receive your scholarship. If you select University of Bristol as an insurance option, you will forfeit any scholarship offer.

Q5. [Mandatory] First Name

Enter your first name.

Q6. [Mandatory] Surname

Enter your family name.

Q7. [Mandatory] Email

Please enter the best email address to contact you at with updates and outcomes regarding your application.

Q8. [Mandatory] Verify email

Re-enter your email address. Make sure your email addresses match or you will not be able to proceed to the next page.

Q9. [Mandatory] Nationality

Select your country of nationality from the list. If you have dual nationality, you only need to select one.

Q10. [Mandatory] What is your permanent country of residence?



This is the country you are ordinarily resident in. This is not a country you have been resident in for the main purpose of full-time education.

Q11. [Mandatory] Gender

Select your gender from the dropdown menu.

Q12. [Mandatory] Current or most recent Education Institution

Tell us the name of your current school or University, or the name of the institution where you most recently studied.

Q13. [Mandatory] Are you a recipient of, or have you applied for, any other funding from another organisation?

This might be a scholarship organisation like Chevening, or your government may fund your studies. You do not need to note any funding from parents/family here.

Q14. [Mandatory] If you receive a Think Big award, how will you fund the rest of your studies and your living costs?

State how you will fund the remainder of your costs e.g. this could be through savings or family support.

Section 2 - Application Questions

There are three short essay questions that you will need to complete. The maximum character count is 1000 for each question, and each question is worth 10 marks.

The questions are different for undergraduate and postgraduate applicants so please make sure that you are completing the correct scholarship application form. Applicants who have not responded to the correct questions will not be considered.

The three questions you will be asked are:

QUESTION 1

Think Big aims to support the brightest and best individuals who demonstrate strong ambition and talent.

Describe any outstanding skills or accomplishments you have achieved outside of your academic grades.

ANSWER 1

We want to hear about any special skills and achievements that highlight your ambition and how you make a difference. These skills and achievements may have been gained through:

- Internships
- Volunteer work
- Extra-curricular activities
- Travelling
- Starting your own business
- Hobbies and passion projects



QUESTION 2

Think Big scholars serve as international ambassadors for the University and recognise the power of diverse networks whilst influencing positive change.

How do you plan to contribute to the student community at the University of Bristol?

ANSWER 2

We are interested in hearing your ideas for how you will contribute to the community once you arrive in Bristol, or any examples of how you've already been an ambassador for your community. This may include activities such as helping out with charitable events, getting involved with societies and student union groups or doing outreach activities where you go and work with local communities.

QUESTION 3

We are looking for Think Big scholars who will use their time at Bristol to make the most of opportunities and realise their full potential.

Tell us about your future goals and how your chosen course at Bristol will support you to achieve them.

ANSWER 3

What is it about the University of Bristol that attracts you, and how do you feel that being part of the university community will help to achieve your goals? Be specific. We want to hear about your personal expectations and anticipated contributions. Remember to link your responses back to the original question.

Section 3 - Terms and Conditions

In this section of the form you will be asked to agree to our data statement as well as the terms and conditions of the Think Big award.

The personal information supplied on the form may be used to help respond to enquiries, and for quality assurance and market research purposes. Unless required by law, your data will not be shared with or sold to any organisation outside the University of Bristol, apart from those that help us to provide this service.

The Think Big Undergraduate Terms & Conditions are as follows:

- Scholarships and bursaries are valid for entry in academic year 2024/25 and cannot be used for any other year of entry. If you wish to defer your entry to the University, your awards will not be transferred.
- Applicants must meet or exceed the entry requirements as stated in their formal offer to study before 31 August 2024; accept their offer and pay any necessary deposit before the deadline stated in their offer letter.
- If you have been offered, or are offered, another University of Bristol scholarship towards your tuition fees, you may only accept one scholarship. If you decide to accept a different University scholarship other than Think Big, you must notify us immediately.



- If the amount of scholarship awarded is more than the cost of the tuition fees, the tuition fees will be covered in full and any remainder will not be issued.
- You are permitted to receive external tuition fee funding (e.g. from a scholarship body, corporate or government sponsor), however the total amount of scholarship funding (i.e. Think Big award + external funding) cannot exceed the amount of your tuition fees. Please notify the International Scholarships and Sponsors Team as soon as you receive confirmation of any external funding, so that your fees can be adjusted accordingly.
- Your Think Big scholarship will be applied as a discount directly to your tuition fees.
 Your fees will be adjusted accordingly at the time of your enrolment at the University.
 No cash alternative is offered.
- You are permitted to receive external living cost funding (e.g. from a scholarship body, corporate or government sponsor), however if you are in receipt of a stipend which is equal to or more than the UKRI minimum, then you will be ineligible to receive a University of Bristol bursary. Please notify the International Scholarships and Sponsors Team as soon as you receive confirmation of any external funding, so that your funding can be adjusted accordingly.
- Bursary awards are to be paid in the first year of study only and will not be paid in any subsequent years.
- You will need to open a UK bank account, into which your bursary funds will be paid once enrolment has been completed.
- Should you wish to change your programme whilst you are studying at the University, please contact the International Scholarships and Sponsors Team to see if it will be possible to update your tuition fee scholarship. We will try to accommodate requests to amend tuition fee scholarships, but please be aware this cannot be guaranteed.
- Your bursary is specific to your chosen programme and may not be transferred if you choose to change your programme of study.
- We are only able to offer awards to students studying in person at the University of Bristol. If you are studying online, you will not be eligible to receive an award.
- Scholarship recipients are expected to be become ambassadors of the University and at times you will be expected to participate in events or promotional activities. Any involvement in these activities will not exceed a total of 10 hours per term and will not unduly interfere with your studies. Possible activities could include (but are not limited to) attendance at a celebratory scholars' reception, completing a survey, writing a testimonial for marketing materials or attending a focus group.
- Information on students is sometimes shared within the University of Bristol and with sponsors (where applicable and relevant to your award) in accordance with United Kingdom General Data Protection Regulation.
- The University reserves the right to withdraw this funding immediately should you do anything which would bring the name of the University into disrepute.



 Future requests for further funding from the University of Bristol will not be considered under this scheme.

Review

Once you have filled in all the application questions and agreed to the data statement and terms and conditions, you will have the opportunity to review your answers before final submission.

Please do check your answers and details very carefully. It will not be possible to edit details after submission.

Submission

Once you have submitted your application your answers are final and you will not have the opportunity to amend your answers again.

If you submit an application with an incorrect student number your application will be deleted.

Once you have submitted your application you will be able to email a copy of your answers to yourself for your records. You will also receive a confirmation email, confirming that your application has been received. This may go to a junk or spam folder so please check these folders if you do not receive an email to your main inbox.

How we assess your application

We look at all areas of your application when assessing your application, however your responses to the three main questions allow us to determine your suitability for the Think Big scholarship programme. We receive a very high number of scholarship applications and unfortunately cannot fund every applicant.

What happens after you apply?

By completing the application form, you will be considered for all scholarships and bursaries that you are eligible for.
