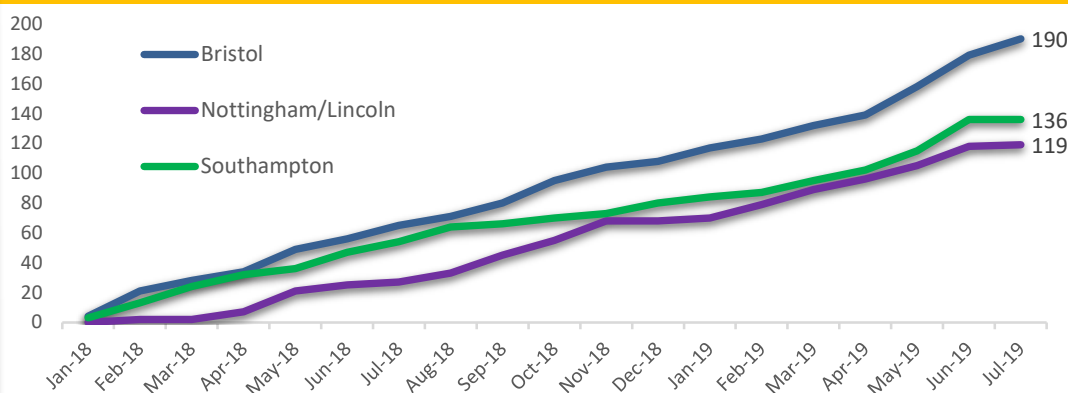

BEE ON TOUR: LINCOLN

Busy has been exploring again this month and his travels have led him to Lincoln to explore the city.

"I was blessed with lovely sunny weather during my day trip to Lincoln. My first visit took me to the International Bomber Centre, a touching memorial to the efforts of the Bomber Command during WWII. I then took a trip to see the 2017/18 Wembley Winners, Lincoln City FC's famous grounds - weareimps!. Next, I buzzed over to historical Lincoln, through the cobbled streets of Steep Hill and it certainly was steep – made me glad I could fly! My adventures took me to Lincoln Castle, built by William the Conqueror over 1000 years ago, and is home to one of only four copies of the history changing Magna Carta. After relaxing in the Castle grounds, I took a walk round the medieval walls taking in the glorious views of Lincolnshire, including the Cathedral, which was once the tallest building in the world. Following a tour of the Cathedral and the surrounding buildings, I finished my trip with a look around Lincoln's city vintage and modern shops. I learnt that Lincolnshire is famous for quite a few other things: the first female policewoman, birthplace of Sir Isaac Newton, Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher and also the tank! The first barcode scanned in the UK, the classic Lincolnshire sausage, and the Waddington Air Show. Lincolnshire is also home to aerobatic display team, the Red Arrows. Phew! Not only did I learn a lot about the history of Lincoln, I had a lot of fun."
