FOLLOW-UP COMPLETE!

We have now followed everyone up for 52 weeks.

As you may remember, the aim of the study was to find out which are the best emollients to start with, for treating the symptoms of childhood eczema – a lotion, cream, gel or ointment?

In 2021 we will start analysing all the questionnaires you have completed and compare the effectiveness (and acceptability) of the different emollients that you have been using.

RECRUITMENT SUMMARY



Participants were recruited across 3 centres – Bristol, Nottingham/Lincolnshire and Southampton.

In total 77 GP practices were recruited to the study.



We recruited a total of 550 participants who have all now reached 52 weeks and completed the BEE study!

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Since your 16 week visit you have been free to change moisturiser if you wanted. Now participant recruitment and follow-up has ended, you should be able to continue to request the same moisturiser you have been using from your GP, if you want.

The information you have provided will be analysed for the first time over the next few months and we should be ready to publish the findings in the summer of 2021.



We will write a study newsletter summarising the findings and send it to you as soon as we can and we will prepare the findings for publication in medical journals. The rules of publication mean that we have to wait until the medical journal is ready to publish the papers before we can send you the details in the newsletter. We will try to send your newsletter to you as close to the publication date as we can.

Although the research team won't know the findings of the study until next year we have already been thinking about what the results might mean. We have been talking to groups of parents and carers to get their views on how the results might be interpreted.
