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

My role involves helping with trial coordination - including randomising patients to their allocated moisturisers. I am also visiting families in their homes, or speaking with them by telephone, to find out more about their experiences of using different treatments for eczema and how they are getting on with their study moisturiser. The information that they provide will help us to

understand more about what it is like for families who are living with eczema and will add to the data that we are collecting in the study surveys.

Things to Remember.....

- Keep filling in your weekly questionnaires. Your information is so important to us!
- We'd like you to use your study moisturiser for 16 weeks.
- If you experience a problem with the study moisturiser, get in touch with your child's usual GP to discuss this.
- ✓ If you do need to change your study moisturiser, when filling in 'Use of Treatments' section of the weekly questionnaire, please answer question 1.2 instead of 1.1.
