WHAT IS REPROVIDE?

REPROVIDE IS A STUDY OF A DAPP

REPROVIDE is an NIHR-funded study of a Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Programme (DAPP) based at the University of Bristol. It aims to find out if a 23-week group DAPP is an effective way to help men change their behaviour, and improve safety of victims of domestic abuse.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

ANY MAN CAN TAKE PART IF THEY...

- ...are concerned about their behaviour towards a female (ex)partner
- ... are aged 21 and over
- ...live in Bath and North East Somerset, Bristol, Gwent, North Somerset, Somerset, South Gloucestershire or Wiltshire.





WHY DO WE NEED A STUDY?

TO PREVENT MORE VICTIMS

Robust research is needed into perpetrator programmes to prevent domestic abuse. Despite some positive findings in recent evaluations, there is still debate about the effectiveness of DAPPs.
