3	25.01.24	Chest pain	 History of chest pain e.g. stable angina or previous acute coronary syndrome Previous symptomatic heart rhythm abnormality, pericarditis or pleurisy Any patient with relevant history willing to undergo cardiovascular examination. It is helpful (although not essential) that they have signs, such as abnormality of heart rhythm (e.g. AF), valve disease (aortic stenosis), heart failure or other signs of cardiac disease.
4	22.02.24	Abdomen	 Chronic or recurrent conditions causing abdominal pain, jaundice or change in bowel habit. Previous episode of acute abdominal pain e.g. previous gallstones/pancreatitis/appendicitis etc.
