How have we been recruiting kittens onto the study?

We have used a variety of methods, the most successful of which have been:

- Advertising on the internet (through Cats Protection, FAB, Pet Forums, Facebook)
- Recruiting through vets and rescue organisations
- Word-of-mouth has also been very effective.

Bristol Cats have been recruited from all over the UK, including: the Shetland Isles, Cornwall, London, Belfast, Cardiff and Norwich.





Are we still recruiting?

Yes. We were initially going to recruit until the end of 2011; however, we are working on plans to continue recruitment during 2012 and to develop questionnaires that will enable us to gather information about Bristol Cats when they are aged 2.5yrs and 3.5yrs....Watch this space!!! We hope you will wish to continue your involvement with this unique study and will soon start to see the benefits gained by your form-filling!

What do Bristol Cats like to do?

68% of owners 'strongly agreed' that their cats like to sleep on the furniture!30% of owners 'strongly agreed' that their cats like to sit on people's laps8% of owners 'strongly agreed' that their cats sleep a lot.

16% of cats had been missing from their home/garden all night

If, for whatever reason, you no longer want to take part in our study, then please tell us, so we can update our records. In particular, if you need to withdraw from our study because your cat is no longer with you, please could let us know the specific reason (e.g. cat went missing, new landlord does not allow pets, cat died due to a traffic accident). This is important information for us and will help us report accurate statistics.

Email/postal reminders for questionnaires are currently being sent to cats aged: 6-7 months, 12-13 months and 18-19 months.
