

Classification in the MA in Law in 2020/21

The classification of the MA in Law in 2020/21 is set out below. This document temporarily qualifies the <u>specific regulations for classification</u> for the MA in Law (page 24) in the Regulations and Code of Practice for Taught Programmes (the 'Taught Code') for 2020/21 and supersedes the document: 'Awards and Classification in the MA in Law in 2020/21 and subsequent academic years'.

The existing regulations on eligibility for the award of a qualification, as set out in the specific regulations for the MA in Law, should be considered in the normal way before classification under these regulations.

- For the purposes of classification, each of the programme marks set out in the <u>temporary</u> regulations for classification in undergraduate Law programmes in 2021, will be calculated, with exceptions stated below. The best outcome from the available programme marks will be used in determining classification.
- 2. The following condition must be met where the relevant programme mark is used as a basis for classification (inclusive of where units marks are disregarded for other reasons see section 7):
 - In programme mark C, the final year of study in 2020/21 must include a minimum of 90 credit points of unit marks.
- For the avoidance of doubt, the introduction of a secondary rule for classification in taught postgraduate programmes in 2020/21, as set out in sections 26-28 of the <u>temporary amendments</u> to the regulation for classification in taught programmes, does not apply to the MA in Law.
- 4. The classification of the MA in Law degree is as follows:

Distinction:	the overall programme mark is 70 or more out of 100, or the overall programme mark is 65 or more out of 100, with a mark of 70 or more in at least half of the credit points contributing to the overall programme mark;
Merit:	the overall mark is 60 or more out of 100, with a mark of 60 or more out of 100 in at least half of the credit points contributing to the overall programme mark;
Pass:	the overall programme mark is 50 or more out of 100;
Fail:	the overall programme mark is 49 or less out of 100.
