NIHR/MRC: Better methods, better research

- Supports research that improves research methods being applied by others anywhere within the remit of MRC or the NIHR.
- Research themes in scope includes global health
- Apply under: research grants; new investigator research grants; or partnership grants.
- Up to £500,000 at 80 % of fEC. Deadline 11 November

Public health intervention development (PHIND) scheme Early stages of development of interventions that address an important UK or global public health issue.

- Up to £150,000 for a maximum of 18 months. Overseas costs at 100% fEC. Runs twice a year.
- Deadlines are Jan 22 and Sept 22

Wellcome global health research opportunities

- Wellcome published a new research strategy at the end of 2020 and has implemented new funding opportunities in support of this.
- Response-mode opportunities are now a streamlined set of just three schemes in **Discovery Research**
 - Early Career Awards for early career researchers
 - Career Development Awards for mid career researchers
 - Discovery Awards for established researchers

Wellcome will fund applicants based in the UK, the Republic of Ireland **and low- and middle**income countries, and coapplicants from the rest of the world if applying as part of a team

"The research we'll support through these schemes must have a primary focus on the **pursuit of new knowledge** and discovery that has the potential to improve human life, health and wellbeing. **We won't fund purely translational research** aimed at developing, testing or implementing interventions or treatments."

Wellcome global health research opportunities

In addition to the Discovery Research response-mode opportunities, Wellcome will be working on three 'Health Challenges':

- Mental health
- Infectious disease
- Climate and health

Each health challenge programme will fund research and other activities in any country according to its goals and defined set of outcomes. This may be through directed funding or through one-off open calls from time to time.

PARC Partnerships Fund

Closing date: 7 January 2022

Open to applications from Africa-based researchers to lead Africa-centred projects in collaboration with colleagues at the University of Bristol.

Research areas may be empirical or theoretical, from any discipline, and related to local and/or national, sub-regional or continental, African Union aspirations for social progress.

Call budget

- £200,000 in total, approximately 3-5 awards
- No precise upper limit for individual awards BUT significant requests must be outstanding value for money. Lower value bids also welcome
- Projects can last up to 12 months, commencing Spring 2022.

- Annual budget of £100k per year, reduced to £50k per year in 2019/2020.
- Consistently oversubscribed, high level of engagement from researchers.
- Leverage the ISF in external international networking funding bids as institutional commitment.
- 2021/2022 call will initially promote engagement with European partners

~50% of these awards did not take place due to the pandemic and encourage consortia building
