# Writing Action with Ash Bond and Helen Comerford (BH05)

Whether it's a superhero-style apocalypse, steamy romance or simply the mechanics of getting a character from A to B, this workshop will help you construct the skeleton of your scene before bringing it to dynamic life. ## The Omnivorous Writer with Constantine Blintzios (GH01)

How does one form communicate with another? What can a writer gain from thinking like a dancer, a painter, or a musician? Poet, novelist, musician and artist Constantine will encourage writers to be omnivorous with their craft, responding to painting, song and choreography to actively engage with 'form-breaking'. It will use an excerpt from Paul Auster's piece *White Spaces* as a template – a response to dancers that Auster has described as profoundly epiphanic and a remedy to his crippling writer's block.
