1. PURPOSE:

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Good psychiatric health is an inclusion criterion for these studies. This SOP helps to assess when this criterion is not met and when a participant should be excluded from the study.

2. PERSONNEL REQUIRED AND LEVEL OF EXPERTISE:

- Investigator or research team.
- Training in administration of the M.I.N.I. (Mini International Neuropsychiatric Interview)

3. MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT REQUIRED:

· Relevant reporting forms

4. PROCEDURE:

If the participant reports previous psychiatric problems, use the checklist below to determine eligibility for the study:

- 1. Have you had a psychiatric diagnosis from a psychiatrist?
- 2. Have you needed to take antidepressants or other psychiatric medication prescribed by a psychiatrist or GP for longer than 3 months?

If the participant answers YES to $\underline{\text{EITHER}}$ question, the participant should NOT be enrolled onto the CO₂ challenge studies.

Important note: The participant may answer "No" to both these questions, however, you may still exclude if you feel that they may be at risk from an adverse reaction, for example if they report a history of panic attacks. If you are in doubt, contact the research team or the designated medical support.
