Introduction

This document provides an overview of the full application form and process for the Think Big international scholarship scheme at the University of Bristol.

Please note, you must apply to study before applying for a scholarship. If you have not yet submitted an application to study at Bristol starting in September 2025 then you cannot apply for a scholarship. To find out how to apply to study, please visit [our international applications webpage](#).

About Think Big

The Think Big Scholarship scheme offers tuition fee scholarships of up to £13,000 per year of study, as well as one-off bursaries of up to £3,000 to support prospective international students at the University of Bristol.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for the University's undergraduate scholarships, you must:

- have applied to any undergraduate course at the University of Bristol, with the exception of Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science;
- start your undergraduate course in September 2025;
- be classed as an [overseas student](#) for fee-paying purposes;
- not already be in receipt of other funding which would equate to more than the full cost of tuition fees alongside a Bristol scholarship.
- have a UCAS ID, Student ID or Kaplan ID;
- meet or exceed the entry requirements as stated in your formal UCAS offer before 31 August 2025 and confirm the University of Bristol as your Firm choice offer in UCAS (subject to UCAS deadlines).

Remember, you do not need to have received a formal offer to study at the University of Bristol but you will need to have applied to an eligible course.

What we fund?

Your Think Big Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee waiver directly to your tuition fees. No cash alternative is offered. Your tuition fees will be adjusted at the time of your enrolment at the University.

The discount is applied each year you are studying at the University. Think Big Scholarships will not be applied for any years not spent at the University, e.g. a placement year in industry or study abroad.

In addition to scholarship awards, you may be awarded a Bursary of up to £3,000. These are awarded in your first year of study only and are paid directly into your bank account once



you have registered in full upon arrival in Bristol. These payments can only be made to UK bank accounts.

How to navigate the application form

1. There are two application forms based on study level. You must ensure you complete the correct form. There is one form for postgraduate applicants and one form for undergraduate applicants.
2. There is no save progress function, so you will need to complete the application form in one session. You will need to answer all required questions to move to the next page. If you have not answered anything an error message will appear informing you of this.
3. Once you have completed all pages, there will be a final opportunity to review your answers. Remember once you select 'submit' this is final. You will not be able to make any changes to your application after submission.
4. If you are completing the form on a smartphone you may need to turn your phone to landscape to see all the text.

Application Form Questions

These are all the questions you must answer in your scholarship application. We recommend you read each question and draft your answers in a separate document first. After you have checked for errors, then transfer them to the application form.

Before you start your application form

Scholarship applicants must have applied to an eligible course of study at the University of Bristol and received an application ID. Without a valid application ID, you are not eligible for a Scholarship and your form will be deleted.

You do not need to have received a formal offer to study at the University of Bristol but you will need to have applied to an eligible course.

Section 1 - Personal Details

You will be required to confirm you have read this Undergraduate Application Guidance document.

[Mandatory] How did you apply for your undergraduate course?

There are several application routes available when applying to study at the University of Bristol. Please select which pathway you used, one of:

- UCAS
- International Foundation programme
- Kaplan
- Global Transfer Programme

[Mandatory] UCAS ID / Student ID / Kaplan ID

Enter the application ID which corresponds to your study application route.

[Mandatory] What degree have you applied for at the University of Bristol?

Select the course that you have applied for from the menu. If your course is not on this list, it is not eligible for a Think Big scholarship.

[Mandatory] Do you intend to make University of Bristol your Firm choice with UCAS?

If your scholarship application is successful, you must make University of Bristol your firm choice with UCAS for the 2025/26 academic year in order to receive your scholarship. If you select University of Bristol as an insurance option, you will forfeit any scholarship offer.

[Mandatory] First Name

Enter your first name.

[Mandatory] Surname

Enter your family name.

[Mandatory] Email

Please enter the best email address to contact you at with updates and outcomes regarding your application. You will need to be able to access this email address until at least July 2025.

[Mandatory] Verify email

Re-enter your email address. Your email addresses must match before proceeding.

[Mandatory] Nationality

Select your country of nationality from the list. If you have dual nationality, you only need to select one.

[Mandatory] What is your permanent country of residence?



This is the country you are ordinarily resident in. This is same as the country you live in for most of the year. This is not a country you have been resident in for the main purpose of full-time education.

[Mandatory] Gender

Select your gender from the dropdown menu.

[Mandatory] Current or most recent Education Institution

Tell us the name of your current school or University, or the name of the institution where you most recently studied.

[Mandatory] Are you a recipient of, or have you applied for, any other funding from another organisation?

For example, this might be a scholarship organisation like Chevening, or your government may fund your studies. You do not need to note any funding from parents/family here.

[Mandatory] If you receive a Think Big award, how will you fund the rest of your studies and your living costs?

State how you will fund the remainder of your costs e.g. this could be through savings or family support.

Section 2 - Application Questions

Remember there are separate forms for postgraduate study and for undergraduate study. You must ensure you complete the correct form applicants who have completed the incorrect form will not be considered.

There are three short essay questions that you will need to complete. These are all mandatory. The maximum character count is 1000 (including spaces) for each question. Each question is scored out of 10 marks.

The three questions for undergraduate applicants are:

QUESTION 1

Think Big aims to support the brightest and best individuals who demonstrate strong ambition and talent.

Describe any outstanding skills or accomplishments you have achieved outside of your academic grades.

ANSWER 1

We want to hear about any special skills and achievements that highlight your ambition and how you make a difference. These skills and achievements may have been gained through:

- Internships
- Volunteer work



- Extra-curricular activities
- Travelling
- Starting your own business
- Hobbies and passion projects

QUESTION 2

Think Big scholars serve as international ambassadors for the University and recognise the power of diverse networks whilst influencing positive change.

How do you plan to contribute to the student community at the University of Bristol?

ANSWER 2

We are interested in hearing your ideas for how you will contribute to the community once you arrive in Bristol, or any examples of how you've already been an ambassador for your community. This may include activities such as helping at charitable events, getting involved with societies and student union groups or doing outreach activities where you go and work with local communities.

QUESTION 3

We are looking for Think Big scholars who will use their time at Bristol to make the most of opportunities and realise their full potential.

Tell us about your future goals and how your chosen course at Bristol will support you to achieve them.

ANSWER 3

Tell us about your plans for your future career goals and what your chosen course will do to help you achieve this. How will you make the most of opportunities whilst in Bristol? Be specific. We want to hear about your personal expectations and anticipated contributions. Remember to link your responses back to the original question.

Section 3 - Terms and Conditions

In this section of the application, you will be asked to agree to our data statement, terms and conditions and academic integrity statement.

[Mandatory] How did you hear about the Think Big scholarship?

Submission

If you apply with an invalid application ID number, your application will be deleted.

Once you have submitted your application your answers are final, and you will not have the opportunity to amend your answers again.

We recommend that upon submission you enter your email address to receive a copy of your answers for your records.

You will receive a confirmation email, stating your application has been submitted. We will not be in touch with individuals to confirm receipt. This may go to your junk or spam folder so please check these folders if you do not receive an email to your main inbox.

How your application is assessed

We receive a very high number of scholarship applications and unfortunately cannot fund or share feedback.

We look at all areas of your application when assessing your application including performing eligibility checks. However, it is your response to the three short essay questions that allows the International Scholarships team to determine your suitability for the Think Big scholarship programme.

By completing the application form, you will be considered for all scholarships and bursaries that you are eligible for.
