Entry requirements

We accept a wide range of qualifications. Our typical requirements are below, and you can find specific entry requirements on our online course pages. Please contact us to check your specific entry requirements and ask any questions before you apply.

Degree type	Accepted qualifications	Find your course
International Foundation Programme	Completion of Grade 11 with minimum grade average of 75%, or Completed High school Diploma with minimum 60%. You may be asked to achieve a particular grade in required subjects.	bristol.ac.uk/ifp
Undergraduate (Bachelor's: BA, BEng, BSc, BDS, BVSc, LLB, MArts, MEng, MSci, MBChB)	Ontario: Grade 12 Secondary School Diploma with an average of 80-90%, including six 4U, 4M or DU courses. Alberta and Nunavut: General High School Diploma with 80-90% in five subjects at 30 level at Grade 12. British Columbia and Yukon: Grade 12 Senior Secondary Diploma with average of 80-90% in five Grade 12 subjects.	bristol.ac.uk/undergraduate
Postgraduate taught (Master's: MSc, MA, MRes, LLM)	Bachelor's degree/Baccalaureate or a Bachelor's Degree (honours) with a GPA of 3.3, B+ grades or numeric grade of 77+ may be considered equivalent to a 2:1 degree.
