Daniel Oudkerk QC is a barrister practising at Essex Court Chambers.

He left Bristol University in 1990 with an LLB and a first edition of Richard Whish on Competition Law inspiringly inscribed by the author: *"I hope you enjoy the kinked oligopoly demand curve"*.

As a junior he had a broad practice with a niche in commercial disputes with an employment 'twist'.

Away from the Bar he moonlighted as the legal adviser on the BBC series *'This Life'*.

Since taking silk in 2010 he has acted in many of the more colourful city claims including the *Tullett Prebon v BGC* conspiracy litigation where numerous BlackBerries found their way into the
