Additional Funder Open Access Polices

The Academy of Medical Sciences

All peer-reviewed, original research publications should be Open Access and available immediately upon publication, if possible. If it isn't possible, then a copy should be made available via Europe PMC within 6 months of the publication date. Your publisher may do this on your behalf, but if not you can use Europe PMC Plus to deposit

The Academy won't fund Gold Open Access separately, but you can cost them into grant applications or use underspend to pay for them where the publication has been wholly funded by the Academy of Medical Sciences. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

When arranging Gold Open Access, The Academy recommends that you select a CC-BY licence.

Alzheimer's Society

All peer-reviewed research publications, funded wholly or in part by Alzheimer's Society, must be deposited in <u>Europe PMC</u> as soon as possible, and no later than six months after publication. Your publisher may do this on your behalf, but if not you can use <u>Europe PMC Plus</u> to deposit

No additional funds are available to pay for Gold Open Access, but the Alzheimer's society are happy to consider requests to use grant underspend on Open Access. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation

All publications arising from the funding should be made Open Access and deposited in an appropriate repository (e.g. <u>Pure</u>) With a CC-BY licence and without an embargo.

The Foundation will pay any reasonable fees for publication in Gold Open Access journals. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

When submitting to a journal you should include the following acknowledgement:

"This work was supported, in whole or in part, by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation [Insert Grant ID number]. Under the grant conditions of the Foundation, a Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 Generic License has already been assigned to the Author Accepted Manuscript version that might arise from this submission."

This will give you the right to upload your accepted manuscript to <u>Pure</u> and <u>Europe PMC</u>, which you must do immediately on publication. If you have arranged payment for Gold Open Access, you should upload the final published version instead.

Underlying data should also be made immediately accessible and open.

Blood Cancer UK

All peer-reviewed research publications, funded wholly or in part by Blood Cancer UK, must be deposited in <u>Europe PMC</u> as soon as possible, and no later than six months after publication. Your publisher may do this on your behalf, but if not you can use <u>Europe PMC Plus</u> to deposit

No additional funds are available to pay for Gold Open Access, but Blood Cancer UK may consider requests to use grant underspend on Open Access. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

When arranging Gold Open Access, The Academy requires that you select a CC-BY licence.

Diabetes UK

Articles resulting from Diabetes UK grant funded projects must be uploaded to <u>Europe PMC</u> within six months of the date of publication. Your publisher may do this on your behalf, but if not you can use <u>Europe PMC Plus</u> to deposit

It is acceptable to also use the Gold (paid) Open Access route. However, no additional funds are available to pay for Gold Open Access. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

Diabetes UK are happy to consider requests to use grant underspend on Open Access. Authors will need written permission from Diabetes UK to do this.

Leverhulme Trust

Charges for Gold Open Access are an acceptable expense. These should be included either within the 25% associated costs allowable on Research Project Grants and Research Programme Grants or within the research expenses category for Fellowships. Open access charges should only be incurred during the period of a Leverhulme award.

National Institutes of Health

Author's Accepted Manuscripts of NIH funded work must be submitted to the NIH Manuscript Submission System (NIHMS) upon acceptance for publication, and be made publicly available on PMC no later than 12 months after the official date of publication.

The NIH offers no funding for Gold Open Access. However, you may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

NIHR

Submitted before 1st June 2022

Peer reviewed research articles (including review articles not commissioned by publishers, final reports or executive summaries), which are supported in whole or in part by NIHR funding, should be published Open Access under a CC-BY license.

This will usually require funding to pay for Gold Open Access fees. Funding can either come from the original NIHR award or an NIHR Open Access Fund. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

Authors should contact the awarding NIHR Programme Coordinating Centre to review the correct approach.

Submitted from 1st June 2022

Peer reviewed research articles (including review articles not commissioned by publishers and conference papers), which are supported in whole or in part by NIHR funding, should be published Open Access under a CC-BY license, without embargo.

NIHR will pay reasonable open access fees. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

Your publisher must <u>have an agreement with the National Library of Medicine (NLM)</u> to deposit the Version of Record in PMC and allow that content to be shared with Europe PMC at the time of publication. This will usually be the case, but you should check.

Your article must include A data sharing statement describing how the underpinning research data can be accessed.

You must acknowledge the NIHR funding using the grant number.

Parkinson's UK

All peer-reviewed research publications, funded wholly or in part by Parkinson's UK, must be deposited in <u>Europe PMC</u> as soon as possible, and no later than six months after publication. Your publisher may do this on your behalf, but if not you can use <u>Europe PMC Plus</u> to deposit

Parkinson's UK will fund Gold Open Access Article Processing Charges in most cases. <u>Contact Parkinson's UK</u> for more details. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's <u>open access</u> deals.

RNID (Formerly Action on Hearing Loss)

All peer-reviewed, primary research publications, except book chapters, reviews, editorials and conference papers, that are supported in whole or in part by RNID funding must be uploaded to <u>Europe PMC</u> within six months of the date of publication.

No additional funds are available to pay for Gold Open Access, but underspend on existing grants may be used. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's open access deals.

Versus Arthritis

All peer-reviewed research publications, funded wholly or in part by Blood Cancer UK, must be deposited in <u>Europe PMC</u> as soon as possible, and no later than six months after publication. Your publisher may do this on your behalf, but if not you can use <u>Europe PMC Plus</u> to deposit

Versus Arthritis will fund Gold Open Access Article Processing Charges in most cases. <u>Contact Versus Arthritis</u> for more details. You may also be able to take advantage of the library's <u>open access deals</u>.
