

Thesis Deposit Declaration Agreement

To fulfil the requirements of your degree you need to provide the University of Bristol (the **University**) with a digital version of your thesis (the **Thesis**).

Your Thesis will be made available on the University's public institutional repository (the current system is referred to internally as Pure and externally as Bristol Research Portal).

By accepting this agreement, you confirm that your Thesis:

1. Is original and that you are the author and owner of the copyright.
2. Is not and shall be in no way a violation or infringement of any copyright, trademark, patent, confidentiality obligations or other rights whatsoever of any third party.

You confirm that:

3. If the project under which the Thesis was written is funded or otherwise supported by any third party:
you have fulfilled any obligations imposed on you by an associated contract or agreement.
4. If you have applied to defer/embargo your Thesis from public access:
you have confirmed the public access date when depositing your thesis, using Pure.
5. You have sought and obtained permission to include any substantial subsidiary material forming part of the Thesis owned by third-party copyright holders in the digital version of your Thesis that will be made available to the public via the University's institutional repository. The rights you have obtained referred to in this clause permit any version of your Thesis to be available in digital format via a stand-alone device or a communications network and the permission encompasses rights granted to the University and the British Library.

You agree/accept that:

6. Your Thesis will be made available in full without charge on the internet via the University's public institutional repository.
7. Your Thesis will be accessible to a wide variety of people and institutions – including automated agents – via the internet and the University's public institutional repository. This will include the British Library Electronic Theses On-Line System (EThOS). Once your Thesis is deposited in our public repository, a citation of the Thesis will always remain visible. Removal of your Thesis may be made after discussion with the University who shall use all reasonable endeavours to ensure removal from any third party services with whom the University has an agreement to store the Thesis.

8. You grant a **non-exclusive, royalty-free** licence to the University of Bristol to make available your Thesis in digitised format via the University's public institutional repository. You remain free to publish it elsewhere in its present format or future versions.
9. Access to your Thesis via Bristol Research Portal will be subject to a CC-BY-NC-ND Creative Commons licence. This will not prevent you from making your Thesis available under a more permissive license on alternative sites.
10. Administrators at the University may, without changing content, digitise and migrate your Thesis to any medium or format for future preservation and accessibility.
11. The University has no obligation to take legal action on your behalf or other rights holders, in the event of infringement of intellectual property rights, breach of contract or any other right in the Thesis.
