The Bristol Festival of Ideas is an annual festival of ideas and debate. It takes place in May with special events through the year. Authors appearing at the festival include Margaret Atwood, Tony Benn, Robert Fisk, A C Grayling, Baroness Susan Greenfield, Nick Hornby, Naomi Klein, Steven Pinker, Tariq Ramadan, Jon Ronson, Ziauddin Sardar, Simon Singh, Alan Sokal and Clive Stafford Smith.

The Bristol Festival of Ideas is five years old in 2009. To celebrate this, and to provide a greater profile for debate about ideas, the festival launches The Bristol Festival of Ideas Book Prize 2009 in association with Arts & Business and Blackwell bookshops.

This prize is to be awarded to the book which presents new, important and challenging ideas, which is rigorously argued, and which is engaging and accessible. The winner will be announced in March each year and will collect their prize at the Bristol Festival of Ideas in May.

Eligibility

The book must have been published in the 12 months of the full year before the award is made (for the 2009 award, this is books first published in 2008). An annual prize of £10,000 is awarded.

We encourage publishers to submit books in all genres written by a single author (the judges will consider books that have been

authored jointly, but not edited collections). A book of ideas may be a work of fiction or non-fiction; poetry or prose. The judges can also call in books that they feel should be considered. Nominations will also be encouraged from reviewers and commentators.

The prize is awarded in association with Arts & Business and Blackwell bookshops. The shortlist will be promoted through Blackwell stores and local, regional and national media. A short publication will be distributed each year which will include details of the books and an interview with each shortlisted author.

The author does not have to be UK based. Publishers should restrict submission to five books initially though can suggest others which may be called in and the judges may call in additional books.
