

PHASE Worldwide, a Bristol based charity, works in Nepal to empower isolated communities through health, education, and livelihood opportunities in order to break the cycle of poverty. Their work has become increasingly important since the 2015 earthquake, as many people are still unable to access basic services. PHASE regularly runs a short term volunteer programme for GPs to participate in teaching, mentoring and supporting staff in health posts in remote areas of Nepal.

Over 70 placements have been completed since the first visits in 2009, and participants have found it a hugely fulfilling experience — at least 30% return a second time.
