

Prepare for Kidney Care Participant Newsletter

Welcome to our first participant newsletter for the Prepare for Kidney Care study created to keep you up-to-date on our progress. We will be sending these out to you at the same time as your questionnaires.

The Prepare for Kidney Care study has now been running for 7 years, and we would like to say a huge thank you for taking part in this vital work.

New patients are still being recruited into the study, and we are delighted to now have 421 patients taking part, which is 82% of our final target of 512!



Across the UK



The Prepare for Kidney Care study aims to help people over the age of 65 with kidney disease make the right decision for them when their kidney function is getting very low.

In the study, patients are randomly allocated to either a pathway where they will plan to have renal dialysis, or a pathway where they will plan to have supportive treatment and care without dialysis, should their symptoms progress. The study will then compare the health and quality of life of the patients in the two pathways.

The study is being run in 31 NHS Trusts across the UK, with Dundee, 3 sites in Northern Ireland, and Salford recently coming on board!
