RECRUITMENT SO FAR...

Since the beginning of May 2012, almost 600 kittens have been registered with the C.L.A.W.S. project. Recruitment for the study will continue until May 2013. Please let anyone you know adopting a kitten from a **UK rehoming organisation** about the study! Whilst we are delighted with every new kitten registered, we are even more pleased when we receive your completed questionnaires. This is because our main aim is to collect long-term data on kittens as they develop into adult cats over the 2-year study period. So please keep your completed questionnaires coming to us!

PRIZE DRAW

The C.L.A.W.S. team are very grateful for every completed questionnaire we receive as it enables us to investigate factors which influence the behaviour and health of cats, in our quest to improve feline welfare. We couldn't do this without you! So as a thank you and an added incentive, all completed questionnaires will now be entered into a prize draw! Every 6 months, all owners who have completed their appropriate questionnaire (for 2-6 month, 6 month, 12 month, 18 month and 24 month old cats) when requested will be entered into a prize draw for a £50 gift voucher of their choice from www.voucherexpress.co.uk. Furthermore, owners who complete all 5 questionnaires during the two year study period will be entered into a draw to win £100 worth of vouchers. So keep those completed questionnaires coming in! - Your kitten is 6-7 months
- 12-13 months
- 18-19 months

RESULTS SO FAR...

Although the first questionnaires 'Your new kitten (aged 2-6 months)' will not be fully analysed until the end of the 2-year study period, here are some interesting facts that we have gathered from our recruited kittens so far:

▼ 55% of 'C.L.A.W.S.' kittens are male, 45% female

■ 83% of 'C.L.A.W.S' kittens are **Domestic Short Hairs**, **9**% **Domestic Long Hairs** and **8**% **Pedigree breeds**

■ 47% of 'C.L.A.W.S.' owners adopted their cats for companionship for themselves, 23% as pets for their children, 22% for companionship for their other household cat(s), 5% for companionship for their other household pet(s) and 3% to catch rodents
