Why study veterinary science at Bristol?

The Bristol Veterinary School has been training veterinary professionals for more than 60 years. We offer you a vibrant city experience at our Bristol campus, combined with immersion in animal science and welfare at our rural site in Langford. You will receive a strong scientific education alongside exceptional professional skills training.

BVSc Veterinary Science

Our curriculum introduces you to the integrated structure and function of healthy animals, followed by the mechanisms of disease and their clinical management. Year one starts with a foundation course in animal health sciences, covering anatomy, physiology and biochemistry. You will continue to focus on animal health sciences for the remainder of year one and part of year two, and you will have hands-on experience of animal management from your first year. Years two and three will cover immunology, microbiology, parasitology and pharmacology followed by clinical management in years three and four. In year five you will work alongside clinical staff and your peers to provide veterinary care for a wide range of species. Your final year also gives you the opportunity for elective study, allowing you to explore clinical work, research and industry.

Extra-mural studies (EMS)

EMS are a mandatory RCVS requirement for all veterinary programmes in the UK. You are required to complete EMS during university vacation in years one to four and scheduled EMS time in your final year. We have good relationships with EMS providers and a dedicated EMS team who can support you in arranging your placements.

Gateway to Veterinary Science

This one-year degree is a widening participation initiative targeted at UK students who have the potential to become vets but do not meet the academic entry criteria to apply directly to the BVSc Veterinary Science. To find out more, visit bristol.ac.uk/ug2021-vetscience.

BVSc Veterinary Science: Accelerated Graduate Entry

This is our new fast-track programme for science graduates, which enables completion of BVSc Veterinary Science in four years instead of five. The programme is taught entirely on the Langford campus and is designed to support independent, self-directed and collaborative learning, adopting best practice in adult education. During the first two years you are guided through case-based, tutor-facilitated teaching and learning.
