## **Manipulating Materials**

**OHM/1/1/5/3** - Piece of plastic, shaped and painted as Titania's bower from A Midsummer Night's Dream, c.1937

**OHM/1/8/4/10/8** - Page with small samples of coloured wools sellotaped to it with annotations regarding the colour names and the quantities of each colour needed, c.1957

**OHM/1/15/7** - Envelope of small triangular embellishments composed of pieces of metal bent into pyramid shapes with sewing holes punched into the centre of each side

**OHM/1/15/8** - Two pieces of embellished fabric originally stored in a glassine envelope labelled Original Trials

**OHM/1/15/9-12** - Envelopes with a variety of embossed pieces for embellishment of costume and props

**OHM/1/15/13** - Envelope from Sol Kahaner & Bro, importers and exporters of beads of every description including different forms of embellishment
